Annual Chairman's Report 2017



The **Parish Council Annual Report** includes contributions from each of the council's committee chairmen on the work of their committees during the past year.

In 2016 Devon Air Ambulance contacted the Parish Council about the need for night landing sites and Cllr Peter Kelly leads the project for South Brent by submitting a planning application for this to be sited at our Recreation Field and obtaining funding of £10,000 from the Big Lottery Fund 'Awards for All'. We are extremely grateful to Peter for all his hard work.

Our **new Parish Plan 2016+** was launched in July by a small working party of Councillors and interested individuals under the Chairmanship of Mr John Gower, to whom we extend our thanks for all their hard work on this demanding project. This is a 'living document' which will be updated and the Parish Council, its Committees and local groups have taken ownership of the key action points in the report and will endeavour to make progress with these over the next few years. (Copies of the Parish Plan and key points are available here this evening.)

On 1 October the Outer Bounds of 11 miles were walked by 102 people. This event (Inner and Outer Bounds) is organised by the Parish Council on 7 year cycle. As ever, without the help of many it could not have taken place. Many thanks to:

- Walk leaders Tim and Fiona Harvey and the Explorer Scouts,
- The W.I. for refreshments provided at the Avon Dam,
- SWW assistance with the opportunity to see inside the dam,
- Cllr Mandy Haley provided refreshments before the last stretch,
- Ending with a pasty and a pint at The Oak, where completion certificates prepared by Cllr Richards and his family, could be collected.

Mandy stepped in to take over organisation of this event and indeed all Parish Council matters for a month while our clerk was unwell and the Parish Council is indebted to her for this.

During this year the Council has established two new working groups, the **Open Space Sports and Recreation Plan (OSSR)** Working Group, to prioritise suitable projects for funding from developers and the **Public Access Defibrillator (PAD)** working group which has secured funding from the British Heart Foundation for three defibrillators which will be located at Moortek, in Church Street and at Shipley Bridge.

During the past year the negotiations for the lease of the **Station Car Park** have been completed with the intention of providing free car-parking to help promote the commercial life of South Brent. The Council has also been exercised with the on-going traffic problems that are being experienced including its concerns about **visibility and speed issues on Exeter Road** at the London Inn Mews and at the entrance to the village outside the **Palstone Meadows (Lower Green)** development.

Following the demise of the South Brent Action Group, the Parish Council has accepted the ownership and responsibility for the upkeep of **the Toll House** in Church Street from the Trustees.

Councillor Glyn Richards Chairman of Finance Committee reports on the work of the **Finance Committee**:

The following comments and information should be taken in context of the fact that the accounts have not yet been audited as the financial year only ended on 31st March.

The lease of the Station Yard has now been completed.

This coming year the budget has been set at £55,536, this is a reduction of £225 on last year

However the total council tax bill will increase by 1.39 % (£0.75 per band D property) due to the local support grant from the government falling by 9.85% equal to a reduction of £332.

As a result of careful budget management we have been able to:

1. Introduce a new budget line of £1,800 for the provision of a Public Access Defibrillator (PAD) and commit a further £500 per year to support this project.
2. Set aside the sum of £1,200 to contribute to the community helicopter landing pad at Palstone Park to allow the air ambulance to make night time landings.
3. These have been made possible, partially due to the underspends of the Parish Plan and Beating the Bound budgets from 2016.

Chairman's Annual Report (continued)

Councillor Sue Gaskin, Chairman of the **Planning Committee** reports

41 Planning Applications have been received over the past year, a decrease of 16% over the previous year. 40 were in the Dartmoor National Park area, 18 granted, 5 refused, 13 pending and 4 withdrawn.

1 was in the South Hams District Council area and was granted.

Only 1 decision made by the planning authority differed from the view of the Parish Council, this application was objected to by the Parish Council but granted by Dartmoor National Park Authority.

Residential Development

Three residential development applications have been submitted during last year.

The first was for properties to be built at Beacon Nursery, Stockbridge Lane, however this was withdrawn. Another application was submitted for the same property but was refused.

The second was an amendment to the Cavanna application from the previous year to allow for access to the next field in the future.

Change

While overall applications have decreased by 16%, residential applications are the most prevalent this year. It is pleasing to note the recommendations of the Parish Council accorded with the planning authority in 98% of applications.

Cllr Peter Kelly, Chairman of the **Open Spaces Committee** reports

(Despite having served over 4 years, there being no other volunteers and after suspension of Standing Orders Peter Kelly was re-elected Chairman.)

The Insurance inspection of the Sanderspool Cross playground equipment revealed that the infant swing set has rotten beams and requires urgent replacement; a quote has been accepted by the Council for the replacement of the infant swings. Also, the see saw and slide are showing signs of wear and will require replacement in the future. A store has been created in the shelter for the cleaner to store equipment and materials safely. The Committee also deals with the following:

- All the seats and signs in the parish are inspected and any repairs carried out.
- The bus shelters are regularly inspected and any graffiti removed, re-decorating the shelters on an annual basis.
- With the lease of the Station Yard, we have confirmed the price for resurfacing of the Station Car Park to ensure that there is adequate insurance cover.
- Inspections of Railway Wood are carried out on a regular basis. Network Rail has recently cut the overhanging branches from the Railway side; they will return and complete the trimming from our side.
- The Parish Plan has been reviewed for key items that will require the attention of the Open Spaces Committee and this work is ongoing.
- As SHDC could not provide a list of Litter/Dog bins in the Parish, a definitive list has been compiled, also areas that would benefit from having bins have been identified and a requested will be made to SHDC. After complaining about the lack of a Dog Bin at Shipley Bridge car park, it is good to see there is now a bin below the map.

We continue to be responsible for any other items that the Parish Council deems to pass to the Open Spaces Committee

Cllr John Rawlinson Chairman of the **Media Committee** reports

The Parish Council Media Committee's main role is to provide information to parishioners. This is done primarily via the Parish Newsletter and the Parish Website. Cllr John Rawlinson was re-elected as chair of the committee on 6 June 2016.

Formal meetings of the committee are held a minimum of twice a year, but much of the committee's work can be undertaken electronically with newsletter development managed by email.

We are most grateful to John Shepherd for continuing to fulfil the role of webmaster.

The Newsletter: Cllr. John Rawlinson has continued as editor ably supported by members of the media committee and the previous editor Cllr. Glyn Richards.

In the last year, the Newsletter has covered the development and initial implementation of the Parish Plan, Beating of the Bounds, various village festivities, community projects such as South Brent Community Radio and Public Access Defibrillators, our involvement with the refugee crisis and the old (if not so favourite) issues involving cars and dogs.

In the coming year, we look forward to keeping the Parish abreast of new developments, whatever they may be. We welcome items for publication from parishioners and local organisations. We will also be asking for your feedback and suggestions about the various ways we communicate with you and provide information. The next newsletter will be published in June 2017 and anyone wishing submit an item should send it to newsletter@southbrent.gov.uk by 5 June 2017 (maximum 150 words; in Word, PDF or Rich Text format). The committee welcomes any suggestions for media or publication and looks forward to the coming year and to making and disseminating any changes consequent to the Parish Plan 2016+.

Other matters

The Parish Council has been able to award numerous **grants** this year supporting the Citizen's Advice Bureau and more locally South Brent and District Caring, The Old School Centre, Brent Island Trust and the 1st South Brent Scout Group as well as assisting the maintenance of our two cemeteries. Also grants have been made to various organisations through the Community Benefit Fund which is administered by the Parish Council from funding for the solar farm at Marley Head. We will hear more about these later.

The Annual Service of Remembrance and Rededication took place on November 8th and was attended by many. It is particularly pleasing to see so many of our uniformed organisations taking part. Many thanks go to those who help organise and take part in the Service. The two-minute silence was held at the Toll House on November 11th. We were once again delighted to see members of the Primary school community taking an active part this year.

The **Christmas lights** continue to draw favourable comments from members of the public. We are very grateful to the organisations and individuals who have once again supported the initiative with sponsorship.

We should like to thank our County Councillor Rosemary Rowe, District Councillors, Cllr Peter Smerdon and Cllr Robert Steer for their attendance at Parish Council meetings, and our own Cllr Cathie Pannell who represents the area on the Dartmoor National Park Committee for their reports at our meetings

We thank Miss Zoe Richards, park keeper of Sanderspool Cross Playpark facilities for keeping the playpark in tip-top condition .

We should like to thank our Tree Warden Mr Guy Pannell for his work advising us on all matters arboreal.

And last but by no means least we must express our sincere thanks to our clerk, Julia Willoughby.

Cartons and Tetra Paks can now be recycled

South Hams District Council has announced that from now on, residents, who until now, could only take cartons to recycling banks and recycling centres, can recycle coated food and drink cartons in their blue recycling sacks. Cartons, such as 'Tetra Pak', are mainly made from wood fibre, which is a natural renewable resource. They are low carbon packaging material comprising 75% paperboard, 20% plastic & 5% aluminium and are 100% recyclable.



Fraud: Fake Police Officers, 'Smishing' and Van thefts

Unfortunately we have had more warnings from Devon and Cornwall Action Fraud:

There has been a series of recent incidents where a lone fraudster has approached victims whom they believe to be unfamiliar with the local area. They make an excuse to talk to the victims such as enquiring about directions or offering a recommendation for a good hotel. After this interaction, several other fraudsters will intervene purporting to be police officers in plain clothes and will sometimes present false identification as proof.

The fake officers will then give a reason to examine the victims' wallet, purse or personal items. They may also examine the first fraudster's items or try to tell victims that the first fraudster is suspicious in order to gain victim trust and appear more realistic in their guise. After all the fake police 'checks' are finished, victims have then reported being handed back their personal items only to later realise that a quantity of money or valuables were missing.

- If an individual claims to be a police officer **ask for their name and rank, force, and examine any identification presented**; this is always good practice but especially important if they are not wearing a uniform.
- The **Police will never ask for your passwords or PIN details**. Do not give this information to anyone.
- The **Police will never request that you withdraw/transfer any money** to them or to a 'safe' account.

There is also an alert about '**Smishing**' – the term used for SMS 'phishing', an activity which enables criminals to steal victims' money or identity, or both, as a result of responding to a an SMS / text message. 'Smishing' uses people's mobile phones to manipulate them into taking various actions which can lead to being defrauded. Fraudsters are targeting victims via a text message, purporting to be from their credit card provider, stating that a transaction has been approved on their credit card. The text message asks for confirmation that the transaction is genuine by replying 'Y' for Yes or 'N' for No. The fraudster then has confirmation of the victim's active telephone number and is able to engage further by asking for the victim's credit card details and/or other personal information.

Protect yourself:

- Always **check the validity of the text message by contacting your credit card provider** via the number provided at the back of the card or bank statement.
- **Be wary of cold calls** purporting to be from banks and/or credit card providers.
- **Hang up and waiting for 10 minutes** before calling the bank back if a phone call from the bank seems suspicious,. Again, **use the number at the back of the card or bank statement** to contact your bank



Please report any concerns about any form of fraud or cyber crime to Action Fraud by visiting www.actionfraud.police.uk or alternatively by calling 0300 123 2040.

After **multiple local thefts from Ford transit vans**, the Police would also like to hear from anyone offered second-hand power tools. Police believe that a silver estate vehicle may be linked to these crimes. Eat a delicious lunch cooked fresh and then pay what you choose at the end. Listen live to South Brent Community Radio over a tasty meal with good company.

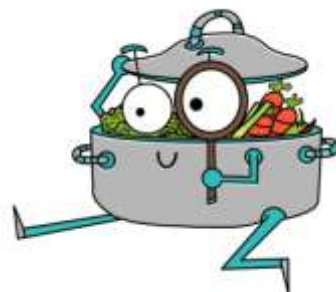
